

Village council met in regular session Monday, July 23, 2018 at 8:00 p.m.

Council present: Karon Lane-pres., Justin Kreischer, John Pupos, John Hudik, Brooke Smith with Richard Sauerlender absent.

Others present: Mayor Ken Wysong, VFO Cathy Vorst and Deputy Clerk Sue Clendenin

Minutes- Justin Kreischer moved to approve July 9th, 2018 minutes as written. Second of motion by John Pupos.

Personnel & Finance report – Committee chair Justin Kreischer said the P&F committee recommends increasing Jamie VanAlstine’s to work 4 days a week, due to preparations for Park-O-Rama. Justin moved to increase VanAlstine’s work hours to 4, eight hour days, effective immediately. Second by Brooke Smith and approved by all council. CINTAS increased cost of uniforms, no notice given. Pupos said he thought the last contract stated no increase during the 36 month contract. A monthly increase of \$6.76 that will slightly increase the tax benefit for our employee. Benefit will terminate at end of contract.

Lands & Buildings –John Pupos said Swanton didn’t clean storm sewers this week, still waiting on new truck to come in. Pouring concrete base for memorial bench tomorrow. Design Memorial to deliver bench August 3rd. Placing bench between and behind the center of the existing benches in front of the Memorial Wall. Steve working on sewer problem on Garnsey, possible uncrushed septic tank. Has yet to hear back from Ohio Concrete in regards to grinding and patching sidewalks.

John Pupos requested employees spray weeds along curbs, want them dead before streets are swept August 6th.

Old Business – Boy Scouts offered to clean up the park Sunday after Park-o-Rama, about 9:00 a.m. Next meeting for Park-O-Rama scheduled for Monday, July 30th at 7:00 p.m. at the Village Offices. Justin and John Pupos walked the new 5 acres where soccer game will be held during Park-O-Rama. Looks rough but don't recommend watering. Ask Boy Scouts to pick up rocks next spring. Justin Kreischer recommends purchasing another Bird-Be-Gone, at an approximate cost of \$100. The one we have appears to be working. Council approved purchase.

New Business – Discussed renting dunk tank during Park-O-Rama. John Crocket has one he may donate for the day. Discussed renting a bounce house. Karon said our insurance will not cover the liability on a bounce house.

Fiscal Officer's report – Council member Rich Sauerlender out of the country for two weeks. Library asking permission to sell old year books during the Park-o-Rama at the Historical Society table. Proceeds to benefit the local Historical Society. Council approved the purchase a 10' by 10' canopy tent to cover Historical table during Park-O-Rama. Council approved. T'Mart owners Cheryl and Gary Truckor kindly offered to donate all ice needed and pop for band members at Park-O-Rama. Floyd Hite asking for a port-a-pot near bike meet by the walk path during Park-o-Rama. Council approved expenditure, agreed it should be placed in stone parking lot west of walk path.

Mayor- Read the Sherriff's report for the month of June. Fulton County Deputy's spent a total of 41.5 hours patrolling the village. Of the total 10.5 hours were spent on the morning shift, 22 hours on the afternoon shift which includes 1 hour of bicycle patrol and 9 hours on the midnight shift. Deputy's handled 9 complaints and issued 1 warning.
